



# Indonesian Prepositions

## Indonesian Prepositions

Learning the **Indonesian Prepositions** is very important because its structure is used in every day conversation. The more you master it the more you get closer to mastering the Indonesian language. But first we need to know what the role of Prepositions is in the structure of the grammar in Indonesian.

Indonesian prepositions link nouns, pronouns and phrases to other words in a sentence. The word or phrase that the preposition introduces is called the object of the preposition. Here are some examples:

English Prepositions	Indonesian Prepositions
<b>Prepositions</b>	Preposisi
<b>inside the house</b>	dalam rumah
<b>outside the car</b>	di luar mobil
<b>with me</b>	dengan saya
<b>without him</b>	tanpa dia
<b>under the table</b>	di bawah meja
<b>after tomorrow</b>	setelah besok
<b>before sunset</b>	sebelum matahari terbenam
<b>but I'm busy</b>	tapi aku sibuk

## in

(also to bits)

**in(to) usually small pieces**  
berkeping-keping

- The broken mirror lay in bits on the floor
- He loves taking car engines to bits.

## in

preposition  
/ɪn/

**describing the position of a thing etc which is surrounded by something else**  
di dalam

- My mother is in the house
- in London

**showing the direction of movement**  
ke dalam

- He put his hand in his pocket.

**describing the time at, after or within which something happens**  
pada

- in the morning
- I'll be back in a week.

**indicating amount or relative number**  
dalam

- They arrived in large numbers.

**expressing circumstances, state, manner etc of an event, person etc**  
ada, dalam keadaan

- She was dressed in a brown coat
- They were walking in the rain
- He did it in a hurry
- written in English
- He is in the army
- The books were tied up in bundles
- She is in her sixties.

## in

adverb, adjective

**expressing the position of a person etc, usually at or to a place where the person etc is expected to be, eg home, office, station**  
ada

- Is Mr Stevens in?
- Is the train in yet?
- Is he coming in today?

**describing something which is fashionable or popular**  
sedang mode

- Short skirts are in at the moment.

**(of the tide) with the water at, or moving to, its highest level**  
naik

- The tide is (coming) in.

**used in adjectives, adverbs, and nouns to mean 'not', 'no', or 'the opposite of'**  
awalan in-

- incorrect
- inconsistently
- incompetence.
