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Ancient Greek

Etymology

From [λόγος](#) (*lógos*, “explanation”) + [-λογία](#) (*-íā*, abstract noun suffix).

Pronunciation

- (5th BCE Attic) IPA^(key): /lo.gí.aː/
- (1st CE Egyptian) IPA^(key): /lo'gi.a/
- (4th CE Koine) IPA^(key): /lo'çi.a/
- (10th CE Byzantine) IPA^(key): /lo'ji.a/
- (15th CE Constantinopolitan) IPA^(key): /lo'ji.a/

Suffix

-λογία · (*-logíā*) *f* (genitive **-λογίας**); *first declension*

- Base for nouns denoting the study of something, or the branch of knowledge of a discipline.

Declension

First declension of -λογία; -λογίας (Attic)

Nominative	-λογῖᾱ -logíā	-λογῖᾱ -logíā	-λογῖαι -logíai
Genitive	-λογῖᾶς -logíās	-λογῖαιν -logíain	-λογῖῶν -logíōn
Dative	-λογῖᾱι -logíai	-λογῖαιν -logíain	-λογῖαῖς -logíais
Accusative	-λογῖᾶν -logíān	-λογῖᾱ -logíā	-λογῖᾶς -logíās
Vocative	-λογῖᾱ -logíā	-λογῖᾱ -logíā	-λογῖαι -logíai
