Etymology

From *tangō* (“I touch”).

Pronunciation

- (*Classical*) IPA^(key): /tanˈɡi.bi.lis/, [t̪anˈɡɪ.bi.lɪs]
- (*Ecclesiastical*) IPA^(key): /tanˈd͡ʒi.bi.lis/, [t̪anˈd͡ʒiː.bi.lis]

Adjective

tangibilis (*neuter* **tangibile**); *third-declension two-termination adjective*


1. touchable, tangible; able to be touched or sensed

*Quae **tangibilia** sunt manu.*

Things which may be **touched** by hand.

Third-declension two-termination adjective.
